This has strengthened the home school links and collaborative working relationships.

Things you've suggested we need to work on and our responses:

It would be great to see the school consider working parents, giving parents plenty of notice so we can make ourselves available when it comes to notifying parents of meetings/ Mass taking place at the school and parents are welcome to join.

Our response

We send a list of dates to parents in September for the entire academic year. This states the date and times of all class and whole school masses, the dates for parent meetings, sports days, nativity plays and open mornings. These dates are also included in the fortnightly newsletters and are also documented in your child's diary. Parents are then sent a message the day before a meeting as a reminder. As a school we cannot do any more than this.

When you send children home with food vouchers because parents can't afford to live or feed their children, I think it's wrong you then ask us for money or donations when life is hard as it is.

Our response

The children in every year band select a charity that they would like to support. Each year band will fund raise for a half term and parents are always very generous, we raise thousands of pounds every year. Whilst we do recognise that many of our families are struggling financially, we cannot ask for a donation from some children and not from others. As a staff, we try to support our families by organising things like coat swaps, distributing food hampers and signposting families to agencies who can offer support. In future we will ask parents for a reduced donation of 50p on non- uniform days rather than a pound.
