KSI and KS2 SATs

Although schools are no longer obliged to deliver KSI national assessments, we will continue to do so, but have chosen to administer these during the week of 19th May and the week of 2nd June. The children in Year 2 will be required to complete assessments in reading, maths and grammar and results will be reported to parents at the end of the summer term. The children in Year 6 will be required to complete national curriculum assessments during the week commencing 12th May. The children will complete tests in reading, maths, grammar, punctuation and spelling and the results of these tests will be included in their end of year reports. All children must attend school during this week, no authorised absences will be granted for children during this week. Children are working hard to prepare for these tests and parents must ensure that they support their children with any homework that has been assigned.



Medical Appointments

If this is not possible, please can you provide the office with evidence of the appointment so that the absence can be recorded as 'M' (medical) and can be taken into consideration when looking at attendance. We will accept evidence in the form of text message, letter, appointment card/slip, prescription, or email.

Sensory Circuits

We are excited to invite you to a special session with our Occupational Therapist, where you can learn more about sensory circuits and how they can support your child's learning and development.

Date: Wednesday 9th April **Time**: 9-10am

Sensory circuits are short, structured activities designed to help children regulate their energy levels and improve focus, coordination, and emotional wellbeing. They can be especially beneficial for children who find it difficult to settle into learning or stay focused throughout the day. During the session, you will:

 \checkmark Discover how these activities can help improve attention, motor skills, and emotional regulation There will also be time afterwards for you to speak with our Occupational Therapist about any specific questions or concerns you may have regarding your child's needs. Occupational Therapists can provide support with:

- Fine and gross motor skills (e.g., handwriting, cutting, balance)
- Sensory processing issues (e.g., sensitivity to noise or touch)
- Self-care skills (e.g., dressing, using cutlery)
- Emotional regulation and managing transitions

Easter

Palm Sunday falls on Sunday 13th April and marks the beginning of Holy Week. We remember Jesus entering the city of Jerusalem knowing that soon he would lay down his life for our sins. The crowds welcomed him by waving palm branches in the air and shouting "Hosanna to the son of David."



The week between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday, Holy Week, is the most sacred time of the church's year. During this time we enter into the passion of Christ, remembering his crucifixion, death and resurrection. Our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving are meant as preparation for the three days of the Triduum.

The evening mass on Holy Thursday begins the sacred Triduum. On this night we remember the Last Supper and celebrate the institution of the Eucharist.

Good Friday is a sombre day when we remember Jesus' crucifixion and death on the cross. This is a time when we examine our lives and consider the times when we have failed to follow Christ and fallen into sin.

Easter Saturday is the day between the crucifixion of Jesus and his resurrection. The Paschal candle is lit at the Easter vigil and remains in the church throughout the year as a sign of Christ's death and resurrection

On Easter Sunday, we celebrate the risen Lord at mass with the singing of the Gloria and the alleluias. We renew our baptismal vows at this time.

As we are not in school during Holy Week, we would encourage parents to take their children to church during the week. The following events will take place at Holy Family Church.





St George

Wednesday 23rd April is the Feast day of the Patron saint of England and also Y2SH Class saint.

All children are to wear white or red to celebrate on Monday 28 April. Please donate 50p.

Born : c. 275/280 Died : 23rd April, 303. Patron Saint of England Feast day: April 23rd

St. George was raised a Christian and always wanted to be a soldier. When he was old enough, he joined the army. The man in charge of the army, Diocletian, hated Christians and had many put to death. Diocletian decided that everyone in his army must worship him and the Roman gods instead. George refused even though the army officials begged him to deny the one, true God. Knowing that he would soon be arrested and executed, George gave all his money away to the poor and prepared himself for death. He was cruelly tortured and then beheaded on April 23, 303.

He is most famous for the legend of St George and the Dragon. In a city called Silene lived a dragon who breathed fire. The dragon poisoned all the countryside. To please the dragon, the people of Silene gave it a sheep every day, for food, and when there were no more sheep, they gave their children to the dragon. The children were chosen by a lottery. One year the lottery chose the King's daughter. The King, sad and desperate, asked the people to take all his gold and silver, and half of his empire - but only if his daughter could be saved. The people refused. The daughter was sent out to the lake, dressed in white as a bride, to be a fine meal for the dragon.

Not knowing this, Saint George was riding past the lake on the same day. The princess, terrified and trembling, tried to send him away, but George said he would stay and protect her.

The dragon came suddenly out of the lake while they were speaking. Saint George made the Sign of the Cross, jumped on his horse and advanced toward the dragon. He used his long spear to hurt the dragon badly. Then he asked the princess to throw her long belt to him. He put the silk belt around the dragon's neck and the dragon followed the girl.

The Princess and Saint George took the dragon back to the city of Silene, where the people were terrified to see the dragon enter. But Saint George told them not to be scared. He said that if the people became Christians and went to Church to be baptized, he would kill the dragon immediately.

The king and the people of Silene converted to Christianity, George killed the dragon with his sword, 'Ascalon', and its body was taken out of the city on carts. Fifteen thousand men were baptized, not counting women and children. On the site where the dragon died, the king built a Church for the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint George.

On St George's day some people in England wear a red rose, or put an English flag in their window. The flag of England is white with a red cross. The design of the flag is often called 'The Saint George Cross'.

Every minute counts

Frequent absence can add up to a considerable amount of lost learning and can seriously disadvantage your child in adult life.

- 5 minutes late every day means around 3 days of education are missed.
- A score of 90% in a test would be a good result but 90% attendance means that a child will have missed around 100 lessons over a school year.

Attendance update

We continue to track attendance every week and work hard to ensure every child in school demonstrates good attendance and punctuality. If children are to reach their full potential they need to be in school every day, unless they are too unwell to attend. We will make home visits from time to time, particularly if we have safeguarding concerns or if a child's attendance is causing a concern. Even if a parent has called the school to give a reason for their child's absence, a home visit may still occur. We aim to offer both support and challenge where needed, but always have the child's best interest at heart.
